The Second of the Three Covenants to the Church (part 2)

Scripture Reading:

Ephesians 2:11-3:6

REVIEW of the 4th Abrahamic Covenant

The 4th covenant that God made with Abraham promised Abraham a singular Seed (descendant, who was Christ) by whom the nations would be blessed. This covenant is mentioned in 5 specific Scriptures:

REVIEW of the 4th Abrahamic Covenant

♦ The blessing of the covenant offered first to Israel - Acts 3:25-26

♦ Jewish Christians encouraged to lay old of "the rest" (from personal efforts) that was offered by this covenant - Heb 6:13-20

INTODUCTION

This morning will look at this extremely important covenant from the perspective of *the past*, when it was made with Abraham,

and <u>the present</u>, as it is fulfilled in the Church – the Body of Christ

ABRAHAM'S PERSPECTIVE (Gen 22:17-18)

Abraham knew this promised seed would be in his lineage, but NOT necessarily be immediately to him, as was Isaac

Abraham knew this specific person of authority would be a deliverer and a conqueror

ABRAHAM'S PERSPECTIVE (Gen 22:17-18) continued

♦ This singular Seed would be multiplied - vs 17

♦ This Seed would bless all nations - vs 18

PAUL'S PERSPECTIVE OF THE SINGULAR SEED PROMISED TO ABRAHAM

♦ This Seed was singular, not plural - Gal 3:16

♦ This singular Seed's identity is the person of Christ - Gal 3:16

That ALL NT grace-believers are baptized by the Holy Spirit into Christ, resulting in the creation of the "the Body of the Christ" - Gal 3:26-27; I Cor 12:12-13; II Cor 5:17

♦Holy Spirit baptism is a creative act by God. Create = to bring into existence out of nothing

CONCLUSION

The fulfillment of the 4th Abrahamic covenant:
Came about by the baptizing of NT grace-believers into the person of Christ

◇<u>This</u> baptism was a creative act of God
◇The creation of a completely new <u>opinion</u> by God
◇<u>Not</u> a creation of anything material

The <u>new opinion</u> resulted in the NT grace-believer's <u>position</u> in Christ

This position in Christ is the framework – the blueprint – of how we are to use our "new covenant" life in our daily lives
