## INTRODUCTION

NT grace-believers are encouraged by attentively focusing on Jesus' example of suffering for righteousness

> Jesus suffered the contradiction (literally, "speaking against") from sinners over their need of <u>initial</u> salvation by grace and not the works of the Law

### **INTRODUCTION** (continued)

NT grace-believers can experience suffering for using God's grace daily living instead of Law-keeping

Jesus: Our Example for Righteous Suffering A cloud of witnesses (ch 11) who exercised faith

Note Rom 9:16 – "So then it is not of him who wills, nor of him who runs, but of God who shows mercy"

 $\otimes$  Lay aside obstructions for this race:

Severy weight

♦ While looking to Jesus' example of endurance (patience) – Heb 12:2-4

# **Child-Training for Maturity (Sonship)**

Heb 12:5-13 "....My son, despise do not the chastening of the Lord...."

God's purpose: to conform us to the image of His Son
Rom 8:29, cf Col 1:15, John 14:9, Col 3:9-10

#### Child-Training for Maturity (Sonship) continued

Heb 12:5-13 "... My son, despise do not the chastening of the Lord..."

#### • Our purpose:

- To <u>correctly</u> respond to God's <u>correction</u> (child-training) vs12
- To run a <u>correct</u> course (for our Christian life) by <u>correct</u> enablement (i.e., grace) - vs 13 - cf Eph 2:8-9
- To pursue peace with all men, especially other believers -vs 14a
- To pursue holiness live out a life separated unto the Lord (we are already separated unto the Lord in our position in Him Col 1:10-12

### The Product of Child-training (Chastening)

Heb 12:14 - Pursuing peace with all men and holiness

Heb 12:15 - Looking out for any shortcoming of NOT living by grace

Heb 12:16-17 - example of failing to see the value of grace

Keep Looking at the Distant Future Line of our Race

(Heb 12:15-17)

Don't fall short of <u>using</u> God's grace: "you in Christ" and "Christ in you"

Falling short of grace would result in bitterness – bitter about putting away a life of personal efforts under law and living life by grace and its resulting disdain and persecution by those of the World System An Illustration of Failure to Appreciate and Use God's Provision for Present-Tense Salvation (Heb 12:16-17)

By profaning grace (counting grace a common thing, nothing special, or hollowed)

• Illustration: a threshold to a building where every filthy foot and shoe treads upon it

Esau despised his birthright

• Gen 25:24
