Hebrews 12: Encouragement to Run the Race of the Christian Life with Patience (Part 4)

Scripture Reading:

Revelation 21:9-27

REVIEW

Last week we began looking at a section of Hebrews 12 that revealed an encouraging contrast between life under Law, or life by God's grace (vss 18-24).

Mt Sinai represented the strict legal demands of the Mosaic Law - demands which were righteous and good, but demands which provided no enablement to fulfil those demands (cf Rom 7:12, 18, 8:3a)

- ♦ Mt Sion (the heavenly Jerusalem)
 represents the glorious conclusion of
 our salvation by grace alone (cf Rom
 5:20-12, Eph 2:8):
 - **♦**Grace for initial salvation
 - Grace for present-tense salvation
 - **♦**Grace for future-tense salvation

INTRODUCTION

Now we continue to examine this encouraging conclusion to our salvation – the heavenly Jerusalem. <u>This</u> city:

- Prophesied in the OT Ps 48:1-2
- Presently being constructed in the third heaven, with Jesus
 Christ as its architect Jn 14:1-3
- Its descent from the third heaven, after the 7-year period of the Great Tribulation - Rev 3:12; 21:2, 10

 - ♦ Details of walls, foundations and street Rev 21:18-21
 - ♦ Description of the temple Rev 21:22
 - ♦ Description of the river of the Water of Life, and Tree of Life - Rev 22:1-2, 17

The Occupants of the Heavenly City Hebrews 12:22-24

♦ Myriads of angels – cf Rev 5:11

♦Unfallen angels are ministering messengers in the Father's presence – cf Matt 26:53

God the Father, judge of all men

Grace believers have already been judged by the Father by seeing them in Christ as co-crucified with Christ in His death on the cross - Rom 6:3; Gal 2:20

The Occupants of the Heavenly City Hebrews 12:22-24

- ♦"...the spirits of righteous 'men' having been brought to completion..." Pre-Abrahamic believers
- **♦Jesus the mediator of the New Covenant**

- **♦ The blood of sprinkling cf Heb 6:19-20**
- ♦ Christ's shed blood and sprinkled upon Himself, the place of propitiation (satisfaction) speaks a better thing – provision of salvation for all mankind – compared to the shed blood of righteousness - ex Abel, Gen 4
