

Positionally Dead AND Alive in the Colossian Epistle

Scripture Reading:

Colossians 2: 8, 14, 16, 20-23

Our position "IN CHRIST" makes up half of our salvation: "me in you/you in me" - *Jn 14:20*

Paul taught positional living "everywhere, in every church" - I Cor 4:17

Peter acknowledged that Paul wrote some "things difficult to be understood" *II Pet 3:15-16*

Positional truth cannot be detected by the 5 senses of our soul, but are known by our human spirit, where salvation has taken place: "flesh is born of flesh, but spirit is born of the Spirit" - *Jn 3:6*

"But we have (a quality) of the mind of Christ", so that "we can know all things graciously given by God" – *I Cor 2:16, I Cor 2:12*

Romans 6 = positionally dead and alive with Christ

Ephesians 4 = positionally have put off the Old Man and have put on the New Man

Colossians 3 = positionally dead and alive and are to put off the behavior of the Old Man and to put on behavior of the New Man

I. Elements of the world system = material goods, commerce, food production (worldly education, religion, entertainment (music, art, theater, sports, etc) Col 2:20-23

- 2. Satan is the designer, engineer, and director of the world system - Jn 12: 31, 14:30, 16:11
- 3. The purpose of the world system:
 - To direct the sin nature in ways acceptable to society
 - To misdirect the attention of believers from "things above, not the things on the earth" - Col 3:2, I Jn 2:15

4. The believer's relationship to the world system
 We are to live in it, while here on earth Jn 17:15

We are not <u>out</u> of it, as to our source
■ Jn 17:16, cf Jn 3:7

We can <u>use</u> the world system, but not "mis-use" i.e., it to its fulness
I Cor 7:31

5. Therefore, we are crucified to the world's control and the world's control over us is crucified

 Gal 6:14 "But God forbid that I should boast except in the cross of our Lord Jesus Christ, by whom the world has been crucified to me, and I to the world"

 6. The dogmatic restrictions of the world system that come form man-made asceticism and religious legalism – Col 2:20-22

- Prohibitions from this asceticism & legalism -vs 21

 These prohibited elements are destroyed (consumed) by their very use - vs 22a

 These restrictions come from commandments and didaskalia from the men (ascetics, legalizers) vs 22:b, cf I Tim 4:1-4

 The failure of false restrictions of the elements from the world system – vs 23
