God's Gracious Provision of His Righteousness to Believers (Part 2)

Definition of righteousness:
 Acting rightly, being correct in
 Opinion
 Activity

God is <u>eternally</u> righteous – Ps 119:142
 Therefore, His righteousness is one of His 7 <u>eternal</u> attributes

INTRODUCTION

♦ God is righteous in all His ways – Ps 145:17
♦ Therefore, God sets the standard of ALL opinions and activities concerning what is RIGHT and what is WRONG

Fallen mankind has developed its own standards of righteousness, contrary to God's standard.
 Therefore, man's righteousness is unrighteous
 Isa 64:6, Rom 3:10

MAN'S NEED OF RIGHTEOUSNESS

Man's need of God's righteousness

Problem stated: All mankind has fallen short of God's glory, i.e. His righteous opinion

⊗Rom 3:23

Problem illustrated: Adam and Eve acted wrongly in relation to God's one command for them

♦ Man's need stated: "to be declared righteous from all things"
♦ Our unrighteous opinions and actions – Acts 13:39

GOD'S PROVISION OF RIGHTEOUSNESS TO MAN

NOT through our attempt to act correctly - Titus 3:5, cf Rom 3:14-20

- But through faith in God's promise(s)
- And through imputation from God

Provision of righteousness for the OT Believer

- Past-tense OT salvation:
 - Abraham imputed righteous by God Gen 15:6, Rom 4:1-3
 - By believing God's promise, God counted his faith for righteousness

GOD'S PROVISION OF RIGHTEOUSNESS TO MAN (continued)

Present-tense OT salvation

- David imputed righteousness by God apart from works after he committed two capital crimes (adultery and murder) - Rom 4:6, cf Ps 32:1; 51:1-12
 - David's plea for complete forgiveness Ps 51:15-17
 - God's imputation of righteousness based on David's recognition of God's righteous requirements
 - David had finally acted right concerning his sin
- All OT individuals called "just" have been imputed as "righteous" by God

CONCLUSION

♦ The ONLY way to become righteous before God in the OT was the be imputed as righteous!

♦ That, also, is the only way to become righteous before God in the NT, <u>but</u> by a new and far more intimate way – through our position in Christ.
