

The Transitional Record of Salvation's Offer to Israel, Now Provided to the Gentiles

Scripture Reading:

Acts 28: 14-48

REVIEW and INTRODUCTION

Romans 11:16-17 uses the olive tree to picture the blessing of God's provision UNTO salvation.

- The root pictures Abraham, who was made holy by his salvation faith (Gen 15:1-6)
- The natural branches picture Abraham's physical offspring through his grandson Jacob (Israel)
 - These branches are holy because they have bee <u>separated unto</u> <u>God's provision</u> of salvation by faith like Abraham's salvation-faith, but not necessarily made holy by personal faith

INTRODUCTION

 Because o the persistent unbelief in God's offer of salvation, God has removed most of Israel from the place of His proclaimed offer unto salvation and temporarily replaced them with a new primary audience for His message of salvation: the Gentiles!

• Beginning with the earthly ministry of Jesus to the end of the book of Acts, we see the transition of the offer of salvation from Israel to the Gentiles.

"TO THE JEW FIRST"

Romans 1:16

- Jesus' exclusive ministry to the "lost sheep of the house of Israel" - Matt 15:24, cf Matt 10:5-6
 - Israel's response Jn 1:10-13

- Paul's ministry to the Jew first
 - Paul's desire for Israel's salvation Rom 9:1-4, 10:1
 - Paul's preaching in the synagogues
 - His method of comparing OT predictions of the Messiah with NT fulfillment by Jesus - cf Acts 17:1-2. KJV "reason" and "dispute"

- FIRST missionary journey:
 - Antioch Acts 13:14-47
 - Iconium Acts 14:1

 - Philippi Acts16:13 (no synagogue, Jewish women met at river)
 - Thessalonica Acts 17:1
 - Berea Acts 17:10
 - Athens Acts 17:17
 - Corinth Acts 18:4-17
 - Ephesus 18:19

Paul's preaching in the synagogues (continued)

- THIRD missionary journey:
 - Ephesus Acts 13:14 47

- Jerusalem Temple
 - Acts 21:16

NOW, TO THE GENTILES

- Jesus: "other sheep have I"
 - •Jn 10:16

- Jesus: "you shall be witnesses unto me"
 - Acts 1:8

- Paul: "the salvation of God is sent to the Gentiles"
 - Acts 28:28

CONCLUSION

• At the conclusion of the transitional history of the Book of Acts, Gods provision offer of salvation is now sent to the Gentiles.

- With the destruction of Jerusalem by the Romans in 70 AD:
 - The scattering of the Jews among the nations
 - The breaking off of most of the natural branches (Israel)
 - The grafting in of the wild branches (the Gentiles)
 - This temporary transition is now complete



CONCLUSION

• For the last 2000 years, evangelism has been emphasized among the nations.

 Many Gentiles have been exposed to the gospel of salvation, and some (Acts 15:14) have responded by faith
